



PRESENTERS

Jimmy Andes — Jimmy Andes has been with the University of Tennessee for over 20 years where he is mainly in charge of the baseball facility. Previously he worked in as a groundskeeper for the Tennessee Smokies.

Dr. Jim Brosnan is an Assistant Professor of Turfgrass Weed Science at the University of Tennessee. He is also the head of the turfgrass weed research and extension program. Dr. Brosnan's research focuses on effective and economical strategies for broadleaf and grassy weed control in various turfgrass systems.

Darrell Denney is a Sports Field Manager at the University of Tennessee where he manages Regal and Lee stadiums for the Tennessee Lady Volunteers. He has more than 30 years experience managing baseball, softball, and soccer fields as well as renovation and construction experience.

Eric Fasbender, CSFM is the Assistant Director of Athletic Facilities and Grounds for Louisiana State University Athletics. Previously Eric was the Head Groundskeeper of the Schaumburg Flyers Baseball Club. He was also the Grounds Manager for University of Oregon Athletics where he and his crew earned two STMA Field of the Year Awards in soccer and football.

Dr. Michael Goatley is a Professor of Crop, Soil, and Environmental Sciences and Extension Turfgrass Specialist at Virginia Tech University. Prior to his position at Virginia Tech he was a Professor in the department of Plant and Soil Sciences at Mississippi State University. Dr. Goatley is currently the President-Elect on the STMA Board of Directors.

Dr. Brandon Horvath is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Plant Sciences at University of Tennessee. Previously, he was an Assistant Professor in the Department of Plant Pathology, Physiology, and Weed Science at Virginia Tech University. Dr. Horvath's research focus is on the management and control of turfgrass diseases and the response of turfgrasses under biotic and abiotic stress.

Bill Marbet is the President of Southern Athletic Fields, Inc. in Columbia, Tennessee.

Dr. Grady Miller is a Professor and Extension Specialist at North Carolina State University. Previously, he spent over eleven years as a turfgrass faculty member at the University of Florida in Gainesville where he was promoted to professor. Dr. Miller's research focuses primarily on turfgrass nutrition and water issues, soil amendments, and evaluation of athletic fields.

Jesse Pritchard, CSFM is the Sports Turf Manager for the University of Virginia Athletic Department. Jesse is in his seventh season directing sports field operations. He is responsible for overseeing fifteen acres of sports turf, the maintenance of four synthetic fields, and the care for athletic grounds.

Dr. Tom Samples is a Professor and Turfgrass Management Extension Specialist in the Plant Sciences Department at the University of Tennessee. His main research focus is the management of turfgrasses exposed to environmental stresses.

Darren Seybold is the Director of Athletic Surfaces for University of Tennessee Athletics. Previously, he worked as the Director of Athletic Grounds at the University of Southwestern Louisiana and Head Groundskeeper of the Birmingham Barons. He also worked with the big league clubs of the Houston Astros and Los Angeles Dodgers.

Dr. John Sorochan is an Associate Professor of Turfgrass Science and Management in the Plant Sciences Department at the University of Tennessee. His research program coordinates investigations on environmental turf stress physiology for golf course turf. Research also includes athletic field management, including athletic field performance and safety, new cultivar and species evaluation for management and use, and sustainable strategies for reduced inputs.

Adam Thoms is a Research Leader at the University of Tennessee Center for Athletic Field Safety. Adam graduated lowa State University with a B.S. in horticulture, and then began pursuing his Master's degree at the University of Tennessee. His Master's project investigated four bermudagrass cultivars, overseeding practices, and mowing programs for athletic fields.

Marty Wallace is a student at the University of Tennessee studying Turfgrass Science. Marty has previously worked for Southern Athletic Fields and the Huntsville Stars. He is currently part of the Turfgrass Management staff for the University of Tennessee.
